EYE2016: Shaping Europe- 50 Ideas for a Better Future

The Report of the 2nd European Youth Event (EYE2016), which took place last May, gathering 7500 young people coming from all over the continent and beyond, collects and highlights fifty of the most concrete ideas shaped by the participants, grouped into the five themes of the event. The Report will serve as a source of inspiration for the MEPs and to provide them with a clear view about young people's concerns, dreams and future perspectives. The ideas showcased in the report will be sent to various parliamentary committees for debate with the young originators during the coming months. The Report is now available in English and it will be followed by a French and German version. Structural higher education reform

The study analyses how different types of system-level (or 'landscape') structural reforms in higher education have been designed and implemented in selected higher education systems.

In the 12 case studies that form the core of the project, the researchers examine reforms aimed at:

- Increasing horizontal differentiation between different types of higher education institutions (for example reforms to introduce or modify the role of universities of applied science);
- Increasing vertical differentiation through increasing or decreasing positional or status differences between higher education institutions (for example, reforms aimed at concentrating research in a limited number of universities) and;
- Changing institutional interrelationships between higher education institutions (for example, through mergers, the formation of associations of institutions).

In each case, the researchers set out to understand the origins and objectives of the reforms examined, why they were designed and implemented, the extent to which they achieved their objectives and the factors affecting success or failure. The overall objective is to provide policy makers at the European, national and institutional levels with policy relevant conclusions concerning the design, implementation and evaluation of structural reforms.

Highlights

#AskNavracsics-helping more young people to engage in their communities

Commissioner Tibor Navracsics, the European Commissioner for Youth, wants to help more young people to engage with their communities through volunteering and other activities. He recently discussed the broad issues with a number of young people online and in person, and now he would like to hear from many more young people across Europe.

He wants to hear young peoples' ideas and opinions on how to make it easier for them to get involved in their communities. These will be used by him and his staff to influence policies and practices at European and national levels. His discussions with young people, along with more formal research into this topic, has highlighted some of the things that discourage young people from getting involved in their communities through volunteering and other activities, including:

- A lack of motivation and information about how to start volunteering;
- Too few role models that young people can be inspired by;
- Not enough information on the opportunities and projects that are available;
- The costs of taking part;
- Very little recognition of all the effort put in;
- Little acceptance by potential employers of the new skills gained through getting involved.

Participants to the consultation will have to give their views on what should be done to reduce or remove these barriers, and any others that make it difficult for young people to engage in their communities.

European Year of Cultural Heritage proposed for 2018

On 30th of August, the European Commission has put forward a proposal to the European Parliament and Council to designate 2018 as the European Year of Cultural Heritage. In doing so, the Commission is seeking to highlight the role of Europe's cultural heritage in fostering a shared sense of history and identity. The 2018 Year of Cultural Heritage will be an occasion to highlight the importance of European culture, and what the EU can do regarding conservation, digitisation, infrastructure, research and the development of skills, to name just a few areas supported by EU funding programmes such as [Creative Europe](#). Events will be organised across Europe, as well as information, education and awareness-raising campaigns. The year will provide an opportunity to seek answers to the challenges of decreasing public budgets in culture, declining participation in traditional cultural activities, environmental pressures on heritage sites, evolving value chains and digital transformation. In line with the recent Joint Communication "[Towards an EU strategy for international cultural relations](#)", it will promote the preservation of cultural heritage as a key element of the EU's external policies, searching for responses to the criminal

destruction of cultural heritage in conflict zones and the illegal trafficking of cultural artefacts.

Eurostat release: July 2016 Euro area unemployment rate

According to Eurostat, the statistical office of the European Union, in July 2016, 4.276 million young persons (under 25) were unemployed in the EU28, of whom 2.969 million were in the Euro area. Compared with July 2015, youth unemployment decreased by 310 000 in the EU28 and by 136 000 in the Euro area. In July 2016, the youth unemployment rate was 18.8% in the EU28 and 21.1% in the Euro area, compared with 20.2% and 22.1% respectively in July 2015. In July 2016, the lowest rates were observed in Malta (7.1%) and Germany (7.2%), and the highest in Greece (50.3% in May 2016), Spain (43.9%) and Italy (39.2%).

Eurostat quarterly labour market flows

According to the Eurostat quarterly labour market flows, based on non-seasonally adjusted labour market data from the European Union Labour Force Survey, out of all persons in the European Union (EU) who were unemployed in the fourth quarter of 2015, 65.7% (13.0 million persons) remained unemployed in the first quarter of 2016, while 15.4% (3.0 million) moved into employment and 18.9% (3.7 million) towards economic inactivity in Q1 2016. Of all those initially in employment, 96.2% (169.7 million persons) remained in employment, while 1.7% (2.9 million) of those employed in the fourth quarter of 2015 were observed to be unemployed in the first quarter of 2016, and 2.2% (3.8 million) transitioned into economic inactivity. Labour market flows show the movements of individuals between employment, unemployment, and economic inactivity. In order to ensure comparability, data published by Eurostat are based on a harmonised methodology. This may result in small differences between these data and those published nationally.

Public Consultation on the Single Digital Gateway

Launched by the European Commission, the Consultation is about the creation of a 'Single Digital Gateway', which would provide easy online access to Single Market information, procedures, assistance and advice for citizens and businesses. The idea behind the Single Digital Gateway is to provide all the information people need to: do business cross-border, travel to another EU country, live, study or work in another EU country.

The Single Digital Gateway would be based on existing portals, contact points and networks. But it would improve and better connect them, and help people to complete the most frequently-used national procedures fully online. With this Consultation the Commission seeks views of all stakeholders on the identified problems and different policy options that can be pursued to address them. The consultation is addressed to businesses, the self-employed and organisations representing businesses, citizens and citizen or consumer representative organisations, public authorities at all levels. Greece lowers voting age to 17

As part of a larger revamp of Greece's electoral laws (which included a change to a more proportional system of allocating parliamentary seats), the Greek Parliament voted on 21st July to lower the minimum voting age from 18 to 17 years. Greece has become the latest European country to lower its voting age in a bid to enhance the democratic participation of young people.

European Union and the Council of Europe join forces to promote Global Development Education and youth cooperation in Europe

The European Commission and the Council of Europe have launched "iLEGEND, Intercultural Learning Exchange through Global Education, Networking and Dialogue" a new project which will strengthen global development education in EU member States by promoting dialogue, networking strategies, capacity building and exchange of good education practices. For the next three years, the "iLEGEND" will foster inclusive and equitable quality education to promote peaceful and inclusive societies, mainly through global development education and intercultural dialogue. The project aims at the inclusion of global development education in school curricula, enabling teachers and youth workers to educate on knowledge and skills to understand, participate in and interact critically with our global societies, and increase the general public understanding of what is global development education.

Implemented by the North South Centre (NSC) of the Council of Europe, the activities will range from residential and online training courses on human rights, intercultural dialogue and democratic citizenship to seminars and workshops mobilising representatives from governments, parliaments, local and regional authorities and civil society.
