### **Report on the European Conference on the future EU Youth Strategy**

The document reports on the European Commission's Directorate-General for Education, Youth, Sport and Culture conference 'Future EU Youth Strategy: Shape It, Move It, Be It', as part of the European Youth Week, which took place on the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> of May 2017. Participants discussed the future of the EU Youth Strategy after 2018. The report presents the key highlights and conclusions of the conference, including the outcomes from the plenary sessions and the six workshops.

### **Recommended Annual Instruction Time in Full-time Compulsory Education in Europe - 2016/17**

The Eurydice report examines the recommended minimum instruction time in full-time compulsory general education in 2016/17 in 42 European education systems. It includes national diagrams illustrating the data by country and by subject. The comparative overview examines the policy changes that have taken place over the last year regarding the recommended annual instruction time and its distribution across subjects. It pays special attention to several subjects which are currently of particular interest at European level: reading, writing and literature, maths, natural sciences, other languages and physical education and health. For maths and natural sciences, it compares the minimum recommended by education authorities with the instruction time reported by teachers and students in TIMSS and PISA surveys.

### **#BeInclusive EU Sport Awards**

Launched by the European Commission Directorate-General for Education, Youth, Sport and Culture (DG EAC), the awards aim to recognise organisations using the power of sport to increase social inclusion for disadvantaged groups. Organisations established in the European Union, public or private, commercial or not-for-profit, that have successfully developed sport projects aimed at social inclusion of ethnic minorities, refugees, people with disabilities, youth groups at-risk, or any other group that faces challenging social circumstances can participate.

Organisations will have to submit their projects, including digital material, like photos and videos (5 minutes maximum), to show their project in action. They should also submit a written description of their project (3 pages maximum), including its mission and vision, showing how it meets the three evaluation criteria of the awards: impact, replicability and innovation.

Three winners will be announced at a special awards ceremony on 22<sup>nd</sup> November in Brussels, Belgium, where the projects will be presented to an audience of sport inclusion experts and receive € 10,000 each.

### **Apprenticeships abroad: Commission gives boost to long-term placements across the EU**

The European Commission is pre-financing seven pilot projects that offer long-term apprenticeships abroad. The aim of these projects is to test experiment placements of at least 6 months, in an effort to promote apprenticeships abroad of a longer duration.

Already today, around 650,000 vocational education and training (VET) learners and graduates can benefit from Erasmus+ funding to support their mobility experiences of 2 weeks to 12 months abroad. Despite the benefits of long-term placements, however, less than 1% of them stays abroad for more than 6 months. The pilot-projects launched this year will therefore offer 238 apprentices a position in another EU country for a period from 6 to 12 months, to identify good practices and bottlenecks with longer-term apprenticeships abroad. These 238 placements come in addition to the 100 apprentices currently involved in similar projects financed by the Commission in 2016. As part of the Commission's overall effort to improve the long-term mobility of vocational education and training (VET) learners, in December 2016 the Commission also proposed the ErasmusPro initiative which will become operational in 2018 and which will allow an additional 50,000 young people to spend between 3 and 12 months in another Member State. Both the pilot projects and ErasmusPro are the first steps towards a European framework for the long-term mobility of apprentices. This will provide concrete guidance for Member States to give young people the chance to develop their skills and enhance their employability, while strengthening their sense of European citizenship through experience in another EU country. The seven pilot projects for 2017 aim to evaluate the demand and capacity for long-term transnational apprentice mobility schemes; identify bottlenecks for long-duration mobility; identify and disseminate good practices and success factors for long-term work placements for apprentices. The 2017 projects will run until end 2018 - early 2019.

**Eurostat release: July 2017 Euro area unemployment rate**

According to Eurostat, the statistical office of the European Union, in July 2017, 3.792 million young persons (under 25) were unemployed in the EU28, of whom 2.670 million were in the Euro area. Compared with July 2016, youth unemployment decreased by 450 000 in the EU28 and by 272 000 in the Euro area. In July 2017, the youth unemployment rate was 16.9% in the EU28 and 19.1% in the Euro area, compared with 18.7% and 20.8% respectively in July 2016. In July 2017, the lowest rate was observed in Germany (6.5%), while the highest were recorded in Greece (44.4% in May 2017), Spain (38.6%) and Italy (35.5%).

**European Parliament approves extra €500 million to fight youth unemployment**

On 30<sup>th</sup> August, the EP's Budgets Committee has approved an extra €500 million for the Youth Employment Initiative, part of a €1.2 billion top-up agreed for 2017-2020.

The Budgets Committee voted by 29 in favour to 3 against, with 0 abstentions, to add [€500 million to the EU Budget for 2017](#). Committee MEPs call on the Commission and Member States to ensure that the whole additional €500 million is fully committed by the end of 2017. The Draft Amending Budget 3/2017 will have to be approved by a plenary vote, scheduled during the 11<sup>th</sup>-14<sup>th</sup> September session.

**Roma inclusion in the EU**

According to the European Commission results of an assessment looking at how Member States are implementing their national Roma integration strategies, more effort is needed to improve access to schooling and employment. The assessment highlights how the situation of Roma has changed since 2011. Overall, the picture is slowly improving, for instance there is now greater participation of Roma in early childhood education and a declining rate of early school-leavers. On the other hand, the assessment also shows that as many as 80% of Roma are still at risk of poverty; although this figure is lower than in 2011. However, in the areas of education, employment, health, and housing, improvements are unequal and modest, according to the assessment.

The Commission is calling for further and more coordinated efforts between the European, national, and local levels. This includes creating national Roma platforms, for example, which bring all these actors together to streamline the work with Roma communities. Member States must prioritise the fight against

discrimination and antigypsyism, and focus on the integration of Roma youth, women and children.

**22<sup>nd</sup>-28<sup>th</sup> October 2017: Seminar on the role of NGO in Remembrance of the Holocaust, Krakow and Oswiecim, Poland**

Organised in co-operation with the Polish Ministry of Education, the Krakow pedagogical University, the Auschwitz-Birkenau International centre and the Council of Europe, the seminar will ensure that representatives of NGOs (INGYOs, member associations of the NGO Liaison Committee, community organisations) have a solid, historical knowledge of the Holocaust, the history of Auschwitz-Birkenau and the diversity of its victims, including Roma. This will include a visit to the camps of Auschwitz-Birkenau and their various blocks.
