DG Interpretation Bursaries

Each year, the Directorate General for Interpretation of the European Commission offers a number of bursaries. Interpretation study bursaries are available to students of all disciplines who have been accepted for a full-time master/postgraduate studies in conference interpreting offered by a recognised university or university-level institution. Eligible applicants should be enrolled in a master's/postgraduate degree in conference interpreting or intend to enroll in one, be nationals of an EU Member State or of one of the candidate countries (Albania, the Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Montenegro, Serbia or Turkey). The amount of the bursary to be granted is EUR 2 400 for those studying in an EU Member State, and EUR 1 600 for those studying in any other country.

Europeana Research Grants

Early career scholars of all nationalities and in any field of the Humanities are invited to submit their research projects which make use of Europeana Collections content to showcase and explore the theme of First World War. Applicants should have a particular interest in cultural heritage and take a digital humanities approach. Applicants must hold a PhD, with no more than 7 years of experience after the completion of their PhD. Their projects must be hosted by institutions, i.e. a university, a research centre, a library lab or a museum, working in one of the European Union member states.

Funding available will be up to 8,000 EUR per successful project. Funding can be used for the buyout of researcher time, travel, meetings, or developer costs. Up to three successful projects will be funded. Projects must be carried out in the semester January - June 2019 and deliver the results by 30th June 2019. Applicants will be asked to provide their contact information plus five keywords and an abstract of their project (max. 300 words). The CV and the project proposal (max. 1500 words) must be uploaded in PDF format.

Young Filmmakers Competition

The competition is part of the #EUandME campaign, which aims to show how EU legislation and initiatives can enable young people to pursue their passions: from training to travelling, surfing the internet to saving the planet.

Filmmakers between the ages of 18 and 35, from the 28 EU Member States, are invited to submit an idea for a short film that tells a story linked to the impact of the European Union in people's daily life.

Entries can be submitted in one of 5 categories: Mobility, Sustainability, Rights, Digital, and Skills & Business.

Each category will have a winner, who will receive a grant of \in 7,500 to realise their film.

Entrants must submit a written synopsis of the film, max 500 words (including title, headings and sub-headings) in English and in their mother tongue. They should also submit a short smartphone video, maximum of 60 seconds, in English or in one of the <u>official languages of the European Union</u>, in which they explain their motivation and the concept of their film. Participants must already have made at least one short film in the past, which they should include in their application.

The 5 winners, for each category, will be selected by a public vote online, which will take place in January-February 2019.

They will receive a grant of \in 7,500 each to produce, shoot and edit their max 5 minutes film by 30 April 2019. Winners will also receive mentoring by one of the professional directors of the jury during the filming and editing process.

Highlights

European Solidarity Corps: first call for proposals launched On 10th August 2018, the European Commissiion launched the first Call for proposals 2018 - EAC/A01/2018 European Solidarity Corps. The European Solidarity Corps aims to promote solidarity as a value, mainly through volunteering, to enhance the engagement of young people and organisations in accessible and high quality solidarity activities as a means to contribute to strengthening cohesion, solidarity, democracy and citizenship in Europe, while also responding to societal challenges and strengthening communities, with particular effort to promote social inclusion. It shall also contribute to European cooperation that is relevant to young people.

In order to achieve its objectives, the Corps implements the following operational Actions:

-Volunteering;

-Traineeships and Jobs;

-Solidarity projects.

The present Call covers the following actions:

- Volunteering Partnerships,
- Volunteering Projects,
- Volunteering Teams in high priority areas,
- Traineeships and Jobs,
- Solidarity Projects,
- Quality Label.

The call is published subject to the final adoption of the European Solidarity Corps Regulation by the legislative authority without significant modifications, and to adoption of the relevant financing decisions.

Special report 22/2018: Mobility under Erasmus+: Millions of participants and multi-faceted European Added Value, but performance measurement needs to be further improved

According to a new report from the European Court of Auditors, student mobility under the Erasmus+ programme generates many forms of European added value and has a positive effect on participants' attitudes towards the EU, countries would not be able to achieve such effects acting alone. However, the auditors found that the indicators used to measure the Programme's performance should be better aligned with its objectives. Compared to previous programmes, Erasmus+ has introduced many innovations with a view to simplifying administration in the area of mobility. However, application and reporting processes are still too complex, say the auditors. Moreover, the innovative Student Loan Guarantee Facility has not produced its expected results.

For the future Erasmus+ programme, the auditors recommend that the European Commission should:

• suggest additional European added value elements, which should be prioritised at the project appraisal stage, monitored and reported on;

• improve the measurement of objectives achieved and prioritise performance when allocating funds;

• simplify the scheme further to reduce administrative burdens, with improved IT tools;

• include school students in Erasmus + Mobility and consider more flexibility for PhD students;

assess the possibility of reintroducing funding for traditional classroom language teaching;

• include doctoral and undergraduate mobility under the Student Loan Guarantee Facility.

2019 EU budget: Council adopts its position

On 4th September 2018, the European Council adopted its position on the 2019 EU budget, confirming the agreement reached by EU ambassadors in July. Areas which receive increased support include research and innovation (Horizon 2020, +5.79%), youth exchanges (Erasmus+ programme, +10.37%), investments in infrastructure (Connecting Europe Facility, +26.46%), and environment and climate action (LIFE programme, +5.20%). More funds are also foreseen in the field of migration. This includes a strong boost to the Asylum, Migration and Integration Fund, which will receive \in 1.1 billion for migration management (+55.80%), as well as additional funding for the Central Mediterranean route and the Facility for Refugees in Turkey. https://bit.ly/2Ngib5o

UNICEF & Eurochild Survey: Europe Kids Want

Online survey designed to capture the views of children and young people on the future of Europe, launched by UNICEF & Eurochild. The survey targets children and young people up to 30 years old from Europe and beyond. Topics include children's experience of family-life, school, and society as well as their thoughts about Europe.

It takes about 10 minutes to answer the survey, which is available in several languages until 21st September 2018.

Results will be announced at a special session of the European Parliament on 20th November, Universal Children's Day, attended by a delegation of children and young people.

Music Moves Europe Talent Awards: new annual European Union Prize for popular and contemporary music

Successor of the European Border Breakers Awards (EBBA), the Music Moves Europe Talent Awards are the new European Union Prize for popular and contemporary music awarded every year to the emerging artists and implemented by Eurosonic Noorderslag (ESNS) and co-funded by the Creative Europe programme. The aim of the Music Moves Europe Talent Awards is to celebrate new and upcoming artists from Europe and support them in order to help them develop and accelerate their international careers. The nominees for the Music Moves Europe Talent Award will be presented at the Reeperbahn Festival in Hamburg in September 2018. The twelve winners of the prize will be announced in November and the awards will be handed over during a grand award ceremony at ESNS on Wednesday, 16th January 2019.

Eurostat release: July 2018 Euro area unemployment rate

According to Eurostat, the statistical office of the European Union, in July 2018, 3.325 million young persons (under 25) were unemployed in the EU28, of whom 2.365 million were in the Euro area. Compared with July 2017, youth unemployment decreased by 466 000 in the EU28 and by 294 000 in the Euro area. In July 2018, the youth unemployment rate was 14.8% in the EU28 and 16.6% in the Euro area, compared with 16.8% and 18.7% respectively in July 2017. In July 2018, the lowest rates were observed in Germany (6.1%), Malta (6.3%) and the Czech Republic (6.6%), while the highest were recorded in Greece (39.7% in May 2018), Spain (33.4%) and Italy (30.8%). https://bit.ly/2wydjhl

Back to school EU programme: Schoolchildren to receive milk, fruits and vegetables at school

Aimed at promoting healthy eating habits among children, the EU school scheme includes the distribution of fruit, vegetables and milk products, as well as dedicated educational programmes to teach pupils about the importance of good nutrition and to explain how food is produced. In the school year 2017/2018, the initiative reached over 30 million children across the European Union. Under the scheme, €150 million is set aside each school year for fruit and vegetables and €100 million for milk and other dairy products. Although participation is voluntary, all EU Member states opted to get involved, either for all or part of the scheme. National allocations for all 28 Member States taking part in the scheme for the 2018-19 school year were approved and adopted by the European Commission in March 2018. Member States also have the option to top up EU aid with national aid to finance the scheme.

Results of the Public consultation on clock change in Europe

According to the preliminary results of a public consultation on clock change in Europe, 84% of respondents are in favour of putting an end to the bi-annual clock change. The results also indicate that more than three quarters (76%) of the respondents consider that changing the clock twice a year is a 'very negative' or 'negative' experience. Considerations related to the negative health impacts, increase of road accidents or the lack of energy savings, were put forward by respondents as motivations to put an end to the change.

The consultation ran from 4th July to 16th August 2018, and received 4.6 million responses from all 28 Member States, the highest number of responses ever received in any European Commission public consultation. The final results of the public consultation will be published in the coming weeks. The Commission will now make a proposal to the European Parliament and the Council with a view of changing the current clock change arrangements.

1st July-31st December 2018: Austrian EU Council Presidency

As of 1st July 2018 Austria took over the Presidency of the Council of the European Union for the third time after 1998 and 2006. Austria shares the Trio Presidency with Estonia (second half of 2017) and Bulgaria (first half of 2018). Under the motto "A Europe that protects" the Austrian Presidency will focus on security and the fight against illegal migration, securing prosperity and competitiveness through digitalisation, and stability in the European neighborhood. In the youth field, the Presidency will focus, inter alia, on the regulation on Erasmus+, a recommendation on mutual recognition of higher education and school-leaving diplomas, and a recommendation on enhancing the learning of languages.

12th September 2017: State of the Union Speech 2018, Strasbourg, France

The President of the European Commission, Jean-Claude Juncker, will deliver his State of the Union address at the European Parliament. This year's speech comes ahead of the 2019 European elections and in the midst of the ongoing debate about the future of the European Union at 27. He will take stock of achievements of the past year and is expected to present the next concrete steps towards building a 'More United, Stronger and More Democratic Union', which was the theme of his 2017 Address. This year, the President will set out proposals that will deliver positive results for citizens by the time of the Sibiu Summit in May 2019. The speech will be followed by a plenary debate. This kick-starts the dialogue with the Parliament and the Council to prepare the Commission Work Programme for the following year. The event will be broadcast live from 09:00 CET on EbS and on the Commission's Facebook page.
